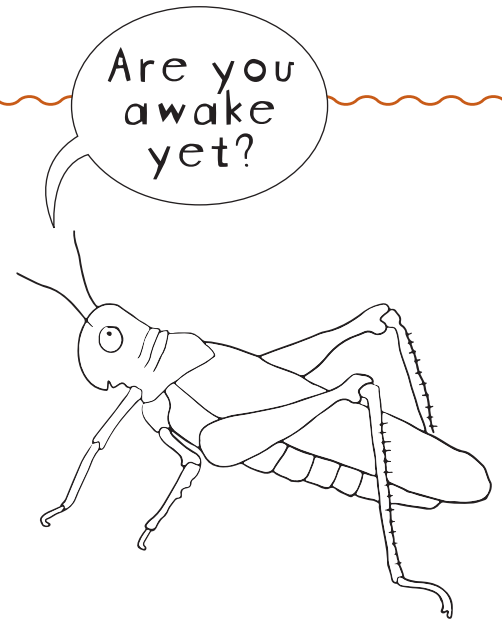


Crazy Crickets

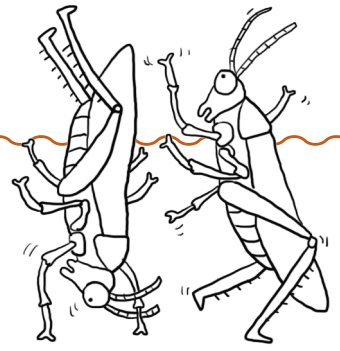
